


On average, Salt Lake gets 20 inches of rain per year in addition to 54 inches of snow per year. Typically, there are 222 sunny days each year in Salt Lake.

## 2024 CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

#### **OUTDOOR TECHNOLOGY DEMONSTRATIONS:**

Live field demonstrations will be held on Wednesday, September 11, from 12:00 to 5:30 PM in an adjacent parking lot. Nearly 30 industry partners will demonstrate products, practices, and systems showcasing the details of these integral elements of our constantly evolving set of bridge preservation tools.

This will be a unique opportunity to see firsthand new, innovative, and fieldtested applications.

#### INDOOR TECHNOLOGY **DEMONSTRATIONS**

Live indoor demonstrations will be held Thursday September 12 from 10:30 AM to 12:00 PM in the conference hotel meeting area. We plan to have 10 demonstrations highlighting bridge management and inspection software, non destructive testing equipment and technology, and web based tools.

Demonstrations will be running concurrently and repeatedly for the duration of the designated indoor or outdoor demonstration time. A site layout for the demonstrations and industry locations is noted on a separate page for ease of use during the demonstrations. The map and a short description of each company and their demonstration will be included in a separate booklet.

#### **TECHNICAL PRESENTATIONS:**

The conference will kick off Tuesday morning, September 10 with a plenary session. This will include a welcome from our host, the Utah Department of Transportation, national updates, and the presentation of the BPP Bridge Preservation Lifetime Achievement Award.

The conference program on Tuesday afternoon, September 10, Wednesday morning, September 11, and Thursday September 12 will be primarily devoted to technical presentations by bridge preservation experts from State DOTs, local transportation agencies, AASHTO, FHWA, academia, and industry. More than 80 presentations will be given on topics related to condition assessment and preservation of decks, superstructures, substructures, and joints as well as performance measures, asset management, and research. The program is organized into three concurrent tracks. Mixed in with the technical tracks will be panel sessions, working group meetings and regional partnership meetings as listed in this program. Friday morning will feature a conference wrap up, final keynote presentation and panel discussion on the current state and future challenges of bridge preservation.
